The San Bernardino County Sheriff-Coroner Department, Coroner Division is seeking a Deputy Forensic Pathologist.

Summary: The San Bernardino County Sheriff-Coroner is accredited by the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME). It was the first and remains the only Sheriff-Coroner Department to hold that distinction. All Forensic Pathologists are independent contract positions. Currently, two full-time Deputy Forensic Pathologists and two part-time Deputy Forensic Pathologists serve under the direction of the Chief Forensic Pathologist. The Sheriff-Coroner has a caseload of approximately 1,600 autopsies per year. (Approximately 1,100 of these are complete autopsies.) Staffing also includes 19 full-time Deputy Coroner Investigators.

San Bernardino County borders Los Angeles, Orange and Riverside counties in Southern California. It is the largest county, geographically, in the contiguous United States, comprising nearly 21,000 square miles. Its population of 2.1 million is fifth highest among California counties. Professional sporting venues and entertainment opportunities in San Diego, Los Angeles and Pasadena are generally within a 90-minute drive of the county seat, the city of San Bernardino. Several Southern California beaches are within an hour drive. Local mountains and deserts provide a variety of recreational locations for rock climbing, hiking, skiing, snowboarding, and the like.

Requirements: Board certification by the American Board of Pathology in anatomic pathology, and eligibility for or actual certification in forensic pathology is required.

Those eligible for certification in forensic pathology must obtain certification within two years of employment. Applicants must obtain medical licensure in California prior to contract approval.

Salary and Benefits: Annual salary for this position is based upon experience and qualifications. The salary range for this position is \$150,000-\$212,000 annually. Increased compensation is available for certain additional certifications. A benefits package is also offered.
