



## Medicolegal Death Investigator 2

Job Summary/Basic Function: The William L. Jenkins Forensic Center in beautiful Johnson City, Tennessee is seeking medicolegal death investigators to perform death investigations into cases that are reported to the medical examiners office. There are two Medicolegal Death Investigator 2 (MDI 2) positions available.

The MDI 2 position conducts investigations into deaths that are reported to the forensic center/medical examiner's office by gathering pertinent circumstantial, historical and other medicolegal data to facilitate the acceptance or termination of jurisdiction based upon information received. This position includes death investigation/scene investigation, photography, evidence preservation/collection, and the securing of personal effects/belongings of the decedent. This position will also aid the forensic pathologist/medical examiner in identification of the deceased and perform death certificate reviews for cremation permits to ensure proper investigation by the medical examiner's office and other duties as required or assigned.

The MDI 2 will act as a shift leader to other investigators; and will also assist the Forensic Operations Administrative Supervisor in conducting quality review of scene photography, scene documentation, and investigative summaries/reports, both for in house and field investigators, while providing training, coaching and feedback to investigators. Contingent on Grant Funding.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Knowledge and skill with lead worker principles. Knowledge of modern death investigative techniques. Ability to present clear and accurate reports of investigation both written and orally. Ability and willingness to perform job-related travel, utilizing personal vehicle if necessary.

Minimum Qualifications: Bachelor's degree with at least two years of experience in death investigation; OR associate's degree with at least three years of acceptable and proven experience in death investigation; OR high school diploma with five years of acceptable and proven experience in death investigation.

Registered with the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators.

Must possess a valid Class "D" Driver's License.
