



Forensic Pathologist

The Waukesha County Medical Examiner's Office is seeking qualified applicants for the position of Forensic Pathologist to start working in January 2015.

Location:

Waukesha County is located in an affluent county located in the suburban Milwaukee area. The area provides abundant cultural amenities including dozens of museums, art galleries, ballet, symphony, and opera. Enjoy more than 140 parks encompassing 21,000 acres of land. Milwaukee is nicknamed the "The City of Festivals" due to an abundance of major events include the Wisconsin State Fair, Summerfest, and dozens of art and music festivals year-round. The area is a family-friendly community that is surrounded by both private and public schools that excel in academic achievement.

Work Duties & Environment:

This position would be responsible for independent investigation of reportable deaths including performing autopsies and medical evaluations of cases. Recent renovations to the morgue provide state-of-the-art technology and communication access during each examination. This office serves as a regional medical examiner center for three suburban counties. In 2015, the anticipated number of external examinations is 200 along with 470 complete autopsies.

The successful candidate will be joining two experienced board certified medical staff including the Medical Examiner and Associate Medical Examiner. The medical staff will be supported by a Deputy Medical Examiner Supervisor, six Deputy Medical Examiners, two Pathology Assistants, and three Administrative Support positions.

Minimum Qualifications:

1. Graduation from a recognized medical school; and
2. Completion of an ACGME accredited anatomic or anatomic and clinical pathology residency with training in forensic pathology; and
3. Certification in forensic pathology and anatomic or anatomic and clinical pathology by the American Board of Pathology within two (2) years of employment.
4. Possession of a license or eligibility to receive a license to practice medicine in the State of Wisconsin.

Salary & Benefits:

2014 Salary Range: \$164,008 - \$198,432 per year. Outstanding benefits package with paid vacation, sick, holiday, and floating holiday time. The position may also have some scheduling flexibility. Other benefit options include health, dental, vision, life and long-term disability insurance. Employees are enrolled into the Wisconsin Pension Retirement System. We also offer deferred compensation and Roth IRA retirement plans as well as a retirement health savings plan.
